Greetings in Christ Jesus,

(As I write this, it is November 23; three days before Thanksgiving.)

I want to bring forth a few subjects. I hope to bring some clarity and hope.

First, as you should know by now, the church has been closed to public worship and all public and semi-public gatherings. The Council (your elected leadership) made this decision due to the spike in Covid cases, which in turn brought on these directives from the State and County governments, as well as our Bishop, who is urging us to remain closed until the end of the year. The Council decided to follow the directives until December 8th, when it will revisit the issue. At that time, we will evaluate the current information and proceed from there. As Pastor, I think the Council has chosen a prudent path.

Now, let's have a little conversation. I'm putting my cards on the table, so to speak. I'm 61, and there are many in our congregation who are older than me, and some who are much older than me. I'm at the bottom of the high-risk group (60 and over). This plague seems to prefer an older vintage. But not exclusively. Many with various conditions at any age can be affected. But as we grow older, the vast majority of us get weaker and get some of those various conditions. Am I wrong?

I've been a pastor for 17 years. In that time, I learned the worst season was and is flu season. I know it's going to hit my congregation (just like every congregation) and we must protect ourselves, especially our most vulnerable. Quite a few years ago a flu hit very hard in Port Huron. My congregation at the time decided to close for two weeks, at its peak. That flu season 2 of my flock went home and a few more were hospitalized. One of those hospitalized was a younger person with respiratory problems. But the high-risk group was the same. I was unable to visit any care facilities or have normal home visitations. That is where I find myself again, today. Dealing with a real hard respiratory infection. This is where we find ourselves today.

If this all sounds a little dark. Well, it is.

However, we can deal with it, we can overcome it. As they say, "this isn't our first rodeo". We'll do what has proven to be right over the years. Our knowledge and experience do hold the framework of the actions necessary to protect ourselves. We're specifically dealing with Covid right now. But it shall pass. Then something else will come along. We'll take the best actions we know now, and in the future when need be. And they're really simple and easy.

Let's go through them again.

If you're sick...stay home!

You can read your Bible. You can re-run my old sermons on our Facebook page or listen to them on disc (available upon request at the church). That is how you can show love...by protecting others. As your Pastor that is how I will see it.

If you're in a high-risk category...stay home!

Show the wisdom of your years, the quickness of your youth. You are in charge of protecting yourself. I'm not expecting 100% compliance on number 1, you shouldn't either. You too can read your Bible or do the other things mentioned above. (Remember audio discs are available upon request at the church!)

Wash your hands.

Yes, this is another really easy one (just like 1 and 2). No matter the season, no matter the occasion, no matter where you are (including the church), wash your hands at every opportunity. Here we (cont.)

have another opportunity to show love by protecting others. And, as a bonus, protecting ourselves. (Soap and Water are available for Members, Attendees, and Visitors at the church)

When you sneeze or cough...cover your mouth!

That's the mainline for viruses, and who knows what else. Plus, it's just plain yucky! Show some love (and even respect) for those around you. Remember what you were taught very young. When you sneeze or cough cover your mouth! Since most of us cough into the side of our fists, it is important to remember number 3... Wash your hands.

(Special Note)

If you cough or sneeze on one your audio discs of my sermons, just throw it out. You can get another one! (They are available upon request at the church)

It sounds rather elementary, does it not? These are the things we can and should do, as individuals, to protect others and ourselves. We already know this. We just need to be more diligent. (Not just now. But, after. Always.) When things escalate, as they are now, we as a community will strengthen our protections. Up to and including closing our facility.

Now, let's talk about caution and fear. We who follow Jesus Christ do not walk in fear. We don't even fear death (Jesus turned that mental concern into a thought of joy and expectation). But caution isn't fear, anymore than meekness is weakness. The Scriptures teach us to be contemplative, thoughtful, and wise. And to be fearless! The Church will overcome. Because He has overcome!

As we head into the Advent Season, no matter how we celebrate it, let's keep our focus on the One who gives us eternal life and strengthens our spirits in the hardest of times.




