There is an old song by Joe South, it's called Walk a Mile in My Shoes. It is about not judging others. The recurring line that hits home is, "Before you abuse, criticize and accuse; walk a mile in my shoes". A problem we have is judging others from a shallow look. We don't know what others are going through. Or, even if we do, we don't know the depths of it. Quite often, when we see people acting a certain way, we come to a conclusion and decide how they *should* be acting. But that is impossible. We haven't walked in their shoes. We don't know the burden they've carried. We don't know the pain they may be suffering. We don't know the heartaches and heartbreaks that have brought them to their place on the journey.

Let's go through a few examples. From time to time we will come upon a person who is lashing out. They aren't lashing out at us particularly. We just happen to be there for an incident. People don't act that way for no reason. They may be going through a stressful time, and aren't coping well with their frustration. Caregivers are a case in point. Having to tend to the sick (and dying) is difficult mentally, emotionally, and physically. It saps our strength on many fronts. We need to be patient and understanding with them through those times. They don't need to be judged...they need strength and encouragement.

Another example is the person who seems to always have a negative attitude. This isn't a short-term thing. It is something that is ingrained in a person. These folks can be difficult to deal with, and we may find it easier to just avoid or ignore them. What we are seeing in this is pain. We don't know what has brought this person to that attitude. Have they been criticized to the point where it is hard for them not to be defensive or contrary? Have they been abused to the point where trust is the hardest thing for them? That person doesn't need judgment, that person needs healing.

We all face problems in life. When it is our turn, we expect others to be patient, kind and understanding. However, we don't see it that way when another person goes through their trials. Why, they should just buck up and straighten out. We don't see it that way for ourselves. Because we know that others have not walked in our shoes, they don't understand the trials and tribulations we endure. As if we are the only ones with true problems. So, compassion for me, criticism for thee.

That is not the way it works. We need to be Christ-like in our attitudes and actions toward others. We need to look a little deeper into the situation. We must do unto others as we would have done to ourselves. Again, we all want to be understood, loved and cared for. If we have that expectation of others, we should have that expectation of ourselves. Think of the difficulties you have faced. Then think about the people that showed you kindness and consideration through those things. It made it easier to endure our trial, it helped us overcome pain and heartbreak, it gave us hope. So, when you come upon someone acting in in any of these ways, remember there is much

more to the story than you see. Take the time to look a little deeper. You don't know all that has transpired. You may find someone who is a wonderful person, just trying to cope. Just like you have done or are doing. You can't walk in someone else's shoes. But you can be of help to someone who is stumbling.


