Fully Human, Fully Divine - Fully Gracious

The angel came to the shepherds – and left. The shepherds came to the manger – and left. They had a lot to say! But then they went back to their sheep.

After all that, Mary was left pondering what had just happened. The puts it this way: "Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart," (Luke 2:19 NIV).

Now that we've had another celebration of Jesus' birth, we have some things to ponder again as well.

Emmanuel means, literally, "God with us." We sang it in many of the carols – but what does it mean for us as we live day to day?

God with us. Before Emmanuel, for a mortal being to meet God face-to-face was terrifying.

Jacob once said "I saw God face-to-face and yet my life was spared," (Genesis 32:30).

When Moses first encountered the burning bush and God spoke to him, he "hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God," (Exodus 3:6).

When Moses did ask God to reveal his glory to him, God had to limit that revelation to a minimum, explaining to Moses, "you cannot see my face, for no one may see me and live," (Exodus 33:20).

When the prophet Isaiah saw the Lord seated on a throne, high and exalted, he cried out: "Woe to me_ I am ruined_ For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty," (Isaiah 6:5).

With the coming of Jesus, the child of the nativity, we – people of "unclean lips" – were not only able to see the LORD Almighty, but could even hold him, embrace him. Former fears have been removed, and we – as they were - are now free to come to a grace so infinitely great it stooped equally low, just to be with us, to become one of us for the sole purpose of reaching us where we are.

In Jesus, God takes upon himself the awful burdens that have made us captives and kept us from coming home to God and the Life we were created to live.

This is the miracle of Christmas – God became one of us in order to rescue us <u>from</u> being slaves of darkness, in bondage to life-draining addictions, by taking all of it upon himself.

Now, in the aftermath of that miracle, I have yet another miracle to ponder – one to be worked <u>in</u> me and even <u>through</u> me, rather than <u>for</u> me.

If God became like me in order to reach me with the grace of heaven – I now become transformed, shaped in that same way to live a life of both grace and truth.

It's not that God changed the truth about what is right and wrong. God did not say that my burdens weren't burdens or that my guilt was undeserved. Rather, God said that all those things – *no matter how revolting they may have seemed to me* – did *nothing* to dim His love for me. I could not – cannot – will never ever possibly be able to change that.

I am beloved, precious.

That is a "magic" that changes me – a power of the Spirit earth cannot comprehend. Basking in the light, I reflect the light. Drinking in God's love, I become loving. Filled with God's grace, I become a vessel of grace, so that those who were afraid or resentful need no longer fear.

That is the point at which I bring grace and truth to life, so that God's goodness will reach them as God meant from the very beginning.

And that makes for a very good beginning of a New Year. May God's grace flow through us all . . .

Fresh Starts are what God gives us every day, every week, every year. We can start this new year with a fresh commitment to give generously to God, trusting that God will continue to give generously to us.


At the end of November, the total Giving for 2019 was \$148,665. The total expensed was \$149,268.


