Children seem to love photos of themselves. Take a picture of a kid, and they'll ask to see it. At least, our grandkids do. Maybe it gives them a sense of identity – "Look! That's me!"

As we age, that huge interest in ourselves gives way to something else – at least, it has for me. I find old photo albums fascinating. Even of people I don't really know! It seems **their** photos stir up memories for **me**. Why is that?

I think it's because of the inseparable nature of identity and relationship as we mature and discover the deeper truths of life.

As children, we long to become "someone." Pictures of "me" help me learn who I am. But, as maturing adults, we see that becoming someone – gaining an identity - isn't truly possible *except* in relationship to others. Now that's a powerful concept for people of faith!



We become the reassurance for a Charlie Brown when his mailbox is empty on Valentine's Day – or bring hope to a Harry Potter whose bedroom is a storage closet under the stairs. We provide the "selfies" the children need to establish a positive idea of "self." Then, as the years increase, we help them shape that identity with lasting values, understanding what it means to have an eternal purpose from the God of Creation, "Our Father, who art in heaven."
