

Pastor David's Corner

I received a phone call today from my friend and your former pastor, Pete Crawford, regarding the death of a member. He was asking me if I would mind if he ministered to the family and officiated at the memorial service. For the sake of protocol this was handled exactly as it should be. I am grateful that he is available. I have not conducted a funeral service in many years, and his willingness to help the family, the church, and me is very much appreciated.

I recall the first week I started at North Lake UMC after returning to Michigan from Kentucky. The morning before I was scheduled to start there, I got a phone call from a member that her mother had died. I went to meet the family to get to know them and get prepared for the service. As the day arrived, I got the news that that morning the member's brother had died. That day I learned so much from that family that established a relationship that lasted many years.

At my next appointment I was tasked with doing funerals for four of the long-term male members who died the first week I was there, including two funerals in one day.

It is a difficult time for families and churches to have loved ones die when a new pastor has just arrived who is an unknown person for the churches and the families to the new pastor. I am thankful that here in Millington there is someone for whom you are as much of a blessing as he is to you. And I also thank my friend, Rev. Wallace Peter Crawford, for following the proper channels and protocol in this matter. He has made a difficult situation less stressful for the family and for me. I hope to assist him in whatever way we can resolve to minister together. My ego is not so big that I can't put families first, as long as we don't overdo it.

Now to some matters of lesser importance. We are entering our second month together. We are still trying to establish ourselves as pastor and congregation. This will take some time and a lot of effort because I am not a resident of Millington. I drive for 45 minutes each way to get to the church three days a week at the present time. I have not yet introduced myself to the leaders of your community, because those introductions take time and proper situations. I am meeting with Pastor Pete for breakfast weekly as we are able, and I hope that these times will generate some learning about who you are and how I can best serve you in my limited capacities. We are in transformation, and we have to learn who we are together.

Stewardship cannot be reduced to a program or a yearly campaign to meet the church's budget. Stewardship is an attitude, a way of life in which every area of life is brought into a faith relationship. It is based on three underlying convictions.

First, all of us have a need to give. Imagine a world without generosity. Imagine a world where everyone thought only of themselves. What an impoverished world it would be. The truth is that generosity is an essential part of what it is to be human, made in the image of God, the One 'who gives generously to all'.

Second, the world has a need to receive. Generosity is not only essential to our wholeness. It is also a sign of Christ's love to others. When we share our resources, we participate in God's amazing work.

Third, money has a power to which we need to remain alert. Money brings with it the temptation to place our faith in it. We know it is possible for our possessions to possess us, to gain the whole world and lose our soul in the midst of it all. We know that money can be a wonderful servant, but a terrible master.

What we do with our finances reflects our priorities and commitments. The fact that we live in a culture that tends to emphasize 'never having enough' or that 'bigger is better', or that 'our spiritual needs can be met by material things' means that generosity does not happen by accident or osmosis. It requires intentional resolve and incremental steps of growth in faith.

A former resident of Millington needs our help. Larry Pedrotti, son of Janet and the late John Pedrotti, has been fighting liver failure since March and is in need of a liver transplant. The complications that he has dealt with have left him in the hospital in ICU for a week or more at a time and has to be repeated frequently. Larry hasn't been able to work, and his wife, who is a nurse, works 12 hour shifts and at times has to miss work due to his condition.

Previous testing shows that the liver failure isn't due to alcohol abuse or hepatitis, or drugs besides his anti-seizure ones, so they really don't understand why this is happening.

A Go Fund Me account has been set up for him, but they recently found out that a percentage of that goes right back to the account. So what they are asking is for donations to help with his medications (which are very expensive), and to help with travel, treatments, and supporting Larry through this. Please donate if you can. Every contribution helps. Your support really matters. And please continue to keep Larry in your prayers.
