We have been talking about our journey with Jesus to go to Jerusalem. This passage from Luke shows us just how difficult the trip became as the enemy sought to deflect even Jesus' closest followers from the extraordinary task at hand.

Consider that Jesus had just been on the Mount of Transfiguration, and He had been told by the Father that the time had come – that all was in readiness for the world-changing event of the death and resurrection of Jesus.

The Samaritans did not welcome them because of the intense hatred between the Samaritans and the Jews. The Jews has condemned the Samaritans because they had intermarried and were therefore not pure.

And so they refused to welcome Jesus and His followers.

When James and John wanted to return hate for hate Jesus pointed out the source of the hate....when He told them "You do not know what manner of spirit you are of. For the Son of Man did not come to destroy men's lives but to save them."

As we draw near to Jerusalem with Jesus, I think that we need to examine what manner of spirit we are of. Whether we are of the spirit of God or the spirit of the world. And whether our lives reflect Christ to the world who so desperately needs Him.

- Giving changes us inside. Giving moderates our drive for acquisition. We live in a materialistic society that pressures us to pursue many things that do not lead to real happiness. Giving resets our internal compass in the right direction, helping us to draw closer to God.
