I want to begin with a confession, I know nothing about quilting. I admire people who can quilt and the amazing hand-crafted art they create. If you have ever been in my office, you will notice that on the small wall opposite my desk is a wall hanging/crib quilt of Noah's Ark. This was given to me when Jacob was an infant, his nursery was animals.

When I am sitting at my desk at my office, I see this hand-crafted crib quilt/wall hanging and think about the hours that it took for Marti to make this quilt. I look at all the animals that are on the quilt and think about how she thought about Jacob as she made it. In the center of the quilt is the ark still floating on water, a dove is flying with a branch in its mouth and over the ark is a rainbow. Now I can look at this quilt and I see that rainbow and think about the story of Noah in Genesis 9:13 "I have set my

bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth."



In the days of old, when warriors would come together, a sign of peace was to have your bow in the air, showing that you could not shoot it at your enemy. That you came in peace. In these turbulent times, I look at that quilt and think about God's covenant with Noah.

As we move into the season of Christmas from December 25-January 6 then on to the season of Epiphany I think about how Jesus is the light of the world, and it is light shining through the water droplets that creates the rainbow. Some of the major things that have occurred locally in outreach to the community this past year, has been that we provided a lunch for the St. Paul's school staff and the staff at the Amish/Mennonite school. The lunches were much appreciated. Another outreach was pretzel dipping during the "Christmas in the Village". This was well attended.

We also supported Angel Tree again this year providing gifts to 20 children of incarcerated parents.

We also supported a Trunk-or-treat in conjunction with the National Honor Society at Millington High School on October 25th.

Please remember also the ministry here at our church as we reach out to the farmers in South America and other places as we purchase Equal Exchange products. This helps these farmers get a fair price for their produce.

They send their best wishes to each of you, and they appreciate the support our church community provides.

Our source of Light

January 6 marks the day of Epiphany, when the wise men (who were Gentiles) came to worship Jesus and bring him gifts. During the church-year season of Epiphany, we remember that God's Son is the Light of the whole world.

Ponder the gifts of Epiphany with these two reflections, written centuries apart:

Your light, dear God, surpasses all other light, because all light comes from you. Your fire surpasses all fire, because your fire alone burns without destroying. The flames of your fire reach into the soul, consuming the sin and selfishness that lie there. But far from damaging the soul, your fire sets it ablaze with love. What moved you to enlighten me with your truth? The fire of your love was the reason. You loved me so much that you could not bear to see me confused and perplexed. Can I ever repay the burning love which you have given me? No, because I have nothing of my own to give. Yet you assure me that the love which you put into my soul is repayment enough. You desire only the joy of seeing me receiving your gift. What more perfect Father could there be!
